The CPNI is a central component of the UK Government’s efforts to reduce the vulnerability of the National Infrastructure from terrorism and other threats. Incorporated within this is the security of critical UK information, both government and corporate. Phil Hodgins will provide an overview of the CPNI function, current threats, and highlight how UK organisations can work with, and benefit from, the services provided by his team.

One Token to Rule Them All - Luke Jennings will present his research demonstrating how attackers can gain complete control of your Windows networks, enabling them to have access to all the business information contained in them. With Windows underpinning just about every organisation, this presentation had a big impact globally, and has been presented at high profile events such as DefCon (Las Vegas), CCC (Berlin) and EUsecWest (UK).

Behind Enemy Lines - Rafa Dominguez Vega will present his latest research findings on Script Injection. While Cross Site Scripting has been well documented, Script Injection gives attackers the ability to gain control of key administrative systems, leaving organisations wide open to an array of potentially devastating business issues. This presentation offers a fresh perspective on this important aspect of application security.
